In 2022, 33,410 Domestic Violence-related assault incidents were recorded by the NSW Police Force.



VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ASSAULT

In the 12 months to December 2022 there were 35,990 victims of DV assault recorded by police:



- · 13% were children/young people.
- Persons 25-34 account for 28% of adult
- 56% of child victims were female.
- · 69% of adult victims were female.



*Excludes 244 victims with missing age or gender

Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) accounts for over half of DV assault victims; 55%

Family violence accounts for over one third of DV assault victims; 35%



RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN OFFENDER AND VICTIM OF DV ASSAULT

Intimate Partner Violence (IPV): current & ex spouse/partner, current & ex boy/girl friend.

Family Violence: child, parent, sibling, other family member.


Other: carer, housemate, persons in authority, other (e.g. ex-partner of partner)

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ASSAULT PERSONS OF INTEREST (POIS)*



In the 12 months to December 2022 there 4,000 were 15,409 alleged offenders legally proceeded against by police:

- 70% of alleged offenders were male.
- · 28% of alleged offenders were aged 25-34



Note: Alleged offenders are Persons of interest (POIs) legally proceeded against by police for a criminal incident. Where an individual is involved in multiple criminal incidents throughout the year they will appear as a POI multiple times.

THREE CORE PILOT PROGRAMS

Wests Tigers Empower will launch 3 pilot programs covering 6 schools and key topics of:

- Leadership and Empowerment
- Goal setting
- Classroom to Careers
- Healthy Relationships
- Prevention of Domestic Violence

These three pilots will directly contribute to driving the outcomes of each other. Starting with the same school wide introduction each school will have a tailored delivery to suit that school.

STRIPES OF SUCCESS PROGRAM

Two schools will be selected to partner in the pilot of our leadership and empowerment program. Concord High School is already signed up and will work closely with us on building the program that is set to start on 22 July and run for 10 weeks.

CLASSROOM TO CAREERS PROGRAM

Two schools will be selected to partner in the pilot of our School to work transition program. Elderslie High School has signed up and will work closely with us on building the program that is set to start on 29 July and run for 10 weeks.

HEALTHLY RELATIONSHIPS & COMMUNITY

Thomas Reddall has been selected to join one other school and partner in the pilot of our Healthy Relationships and Community program. The selected schools will work closely with us on building the program that is set to start on 22 July and run for 10 weeks.

STRIPES OF SUCCESS

EMPOWER KIDS AT RISK TO BE THE BEST THEY CAN BE

This program will spend 12 weeks working with kids on developing leadership skills. Through weekly tasks and connection the kids will be challenged every week to show the behaviours of success



CLASSROOM TO CAREERS

INSPIRE KIDS IN THEIR CAREER DECISIONS

This program will provide kids with advice, direction and contacts to their industry of choice. Working with careers advisors to focus on kids not looking to complete HSC or gain ATAR.



HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS & COMMUNITY

EDUCATE KIDS ON HEALTHLY RELATIONSHIPS

This program is to start the conversation about what are healthy relationships are and how to prevent long term gender based violence and culture.






